WHAT'S INVOLVED?

In a rapidly changing world, young people need support to make informed choices about future careers more than ever.

Learn to Earn motivates students by encouraging them to consider financial plans for the future, set goals and think about their future study options.

Through a range of scenarios, tasks and activities, the day provides students with knowledge of the skills necessary to make successful transitions to the next stage of their life.

80% of students agree or strongly agree that they can calculate and balance a realistic cost of living budget after the programme, compared to 47% before.

78% of students agree or strongly agree that they know about the skills employers are looking for after the programme, compared to 56% before.

- Explain personal hopes and dreams for the future; describe personal strengths and preferences and what success means.
- Calculate and balance realistic cost of living budgets
- Consider a wide range of ambitious job and career options and know how to make informed decisions about career and lifestyle choices
- Understand the benefits of different progression options, including apprenticeships, education or training, and how STEM subjects help to gain entry to a wide range of careers
- Understand the skills necessary to make successful transitions to the next stage of life and employer expectations
- Set SMART goals and plan next steps to achieve these goals
